

PROJECT PROPOSAL: The NZHIA iHemp Discovery & Investment Tour

INTRODUCTION

The NZ Hemp Industries Association Inc (NZHIA), established in 1997 is a non-profit incorporated organisation, promoting the economic, environmental, health and social benefits of the NZ hemp industry.

The primary focus of the NZHIA in 2022 is an AGMARDT funded iHemp network and industry building initiative.

Our aim is to help build a collaborative network to enable scaled growth of this emerging industry, across a number of sectors, by providing information and direction that will encourage 'light bulb' moments, to show attendees how to incorporate iHemp into their business plans.

BACKGROUND

To achieve this network, of connected community-based individuals and businesses, we are doing a nationwide roadshow "The NZHIA iHemp Discovery & Investment Tour 2022".

The Tour will promote the iHemp industry to key stakeholders, such as members of Maori/Iwi based groups, entrepreneurs, investors and the R&D communities, throughout Aotearoa New Zealand, to encourage their interest and participation in the iHemp industry.

Commencing in June 2022, the Tour will travel from Whangārei to Gore hosting in town halls, universities and smaller hui and workshops, with the specific outcome of developing a community of interested people across the farming, food, fibre and health sectors.

We will identify a realistic understanding of gaps in the value chain, and show stakeholders they can use their regional strengths and capabilities to create and scale a new sustainable primary industry, with high export potential, that benefits the environment and economy.



INDUSTRY POTENTIAL - WHY THIS IS IMPORTANT

The environment, the economy, the government and consumers are moving to sustainable industries to help achieve their goals, ranging from climate change to export and growth targets. National conversations about affordable health, housing and food can be positively influenced by industrial hemp.


We need to build resilient supply chains and thriving regional economies which will develop economic opportunities for the whole of Aotearoa New Zealand. Using sustainable crops of seed and fibre with the qualities of industrial hemp makes both environmental and economic sense.

Leaders in the industry have developed two growth scenarios for Hemp in Aotearoa New Zealand 2030: NZ Hemp Export Driven Investor Report.

SCENARIO 1:

(Status quo) seed and fibre products estimated at \$500 million with around 5,000 new jobs.

SCENARIO 2: Is based on political reform of the nutraceutical regulations, and forecasts total earnings of \$2.0 billion; from \$183 million in seed products, and \$317 in fibre products, \$1.5 billion in hemp nutraceuticals and 20,000 new jobs in the regions.


